

SELECTION IS DETERMINED BY A NURSING ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

Admission into the nursing program is a separate process from admission to the college. Required forms are available in January from the nursing department. Enrollment is limited and competitive. Applicants receive points based on GPA, references, work experience, awards, support course completion, and entrance exam results. Candidates will be notified by mail of admission status. An application for admission is in effect for only one year. Class selection for the practical nursing program will be made in March. If applicants who have been granted admission to the program are unable to accept their appointments, admission will be reopened to alternate candidates.



The clinical sites at area health care facilities give students invaluable experience in patient care.

At CEU-San Juan Campus, nursing theory is correlated with knowledge from the biological, physical, and behavioral sciences. Qualified nurse educators guide students in theory, laboratory practice, and clinical experiences using the hospital, extended-care facilities, clinics, home, and other health-related environments. The nursing program has NLN accreditation through the Associate Degree Council and is approved by the Utah State Board of Nursing.

WE NOW OFFER LPN AND RN PROGRAMS IN THE SAME YEAR

Our LPN and RN programs are now operating simultaneously. Eligible LPN graduates can enter the RN program without waiting for an alternate year entry. Successful applicants can work towards an associate of applied science in nursing degree leading toward RN licensure.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR RN ADMISSION:

1. Fulfill CEU admission requirements.
2. Submit a completed practical nursing application by Feb. 28.
3. Complete high school graduation requirements or have GED certification.
4. Complete a college entrance exam with results indicating competency in math and English OR show completion of developmental course work in math and English (minimum 2.0 GPA).
5. Pass the nursing program entrance examination.
6. Show completion of high school biology (one credit) and high school chemistry (one credit) or CHEM 1010 (minimum 2.0 GPA). Show completion of computer literacy or successful course challenge.

7. Have the personality to work and relate effectively with others.
8. Provide own transportation to clinical sites.
9. Have mental and physical health that allows the applicant to safely and competently practice nursing.

Each nursing program is a 2.5 semester curriculum that begins second summer session (in June or July). Completion of program qualifies the student to take the NCLEX examination for nursing licensure in the state of Utah.

Prior to beginning clinical course work, students must provide documentation of certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and evidence of receiving proper vaccinations. In compliance with state law for nursing licensure, all applicants will be subject to a criminal background check.

Students are strongly encouraged to consult with CEU nursing advisors when planning curriculum design.

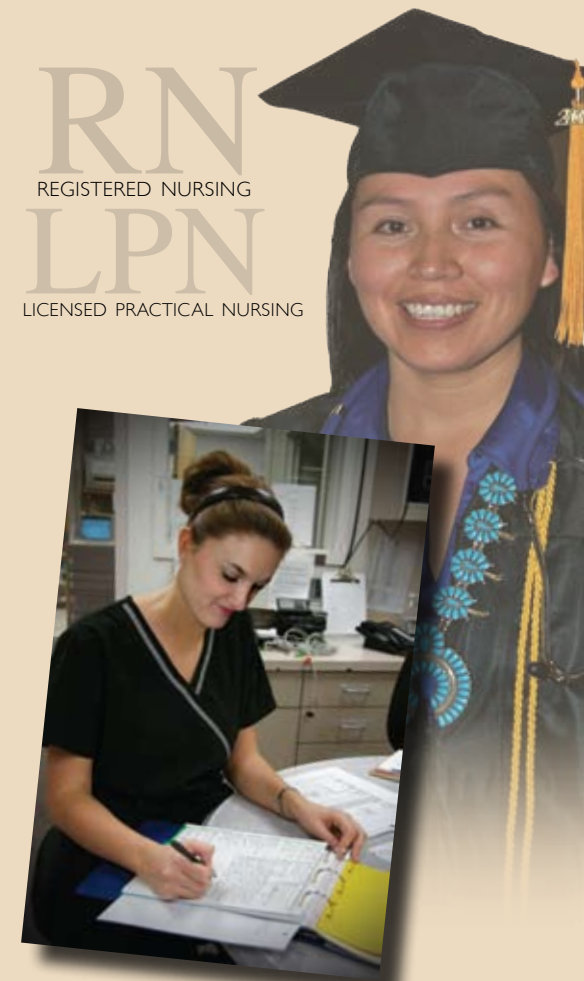
